

## Civil Rights Movement

**Background:** Recently, we've been learning about the Origins of the Civil Rights Movement and have been examining it from a very biased perspective. You will now have the opportunity to present other Civil Rights Movements.

**Directions:** Using Padlet, you will create a multimedia presentation reflecting a Civil Rights Movement not discussed in class. Some examples of what you could do include:

- ◇ Women's Rights
- ◇ LGBTQ+
- ◇ Chicano Rights
- ◇ Asian American Rights
- ◇ Disability Rights
- ◇ Native American Rights

I know I did not include everything. If there is a topic you would really like to do, just clear it with me before you do so.

Your Padlet should be colorful, informative and educational. Your Padlet should represent both the positives and the negatives of your movement. You should have the following throughout your Padlet:

- ◇ Important events and people that helped shaped the movement
- ◇ Music
- ◇ Books (Fiction and non-Fiction)
- ◇ News articles
- ◇ Artwork
- ◇ Movies/TV Shows
- ◇ Educational videos and/or documentaries
- ◇ Anything that you think will add to your Padlet

This is an opportunity to not only learn about other Civil Rights Movements, but also celebrate them as well. In total, have at least 20 posts, but I would recommend more. 3 of your post **MUST** be videos with some type of analysis.

Focus on your movement's role in the U.S. since the 1950s-present. If there is something you feel should be included that is not from that timeframe, feel free to include it in your padlet.

You will have today, Friday and Monday of class next week to work on this. Your Padlet will be due by Monday, May 1<sup>st</sup> by 11:59 p.m., via Canvas. **NO LATE PADLETS WILL BE ACCEPTED!** You may work with a partner or by yourself. Your choice.

We will begin presenting these in class on Tuesday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>.

In total, this is worth **100 points**.

## How to Use Padlet

- 1) Go to [www.padlet.com](http://www.padlet.com)
- 2) Select **Sign up for Free**
- 3) Select **Sign up with Microsoft**
  - ◇ Use your school account to create an account
- 4) Select **Make a Padlet**
  - ◇ You may use **ANY** of the templates **EXCEPT** Stream or Map
  - ◇ Wall, Grid, Shelf, Canvas and Timeline may be used
  - ◇ With your accounts, you get 3 free Padlets, so feel free to test out some of the different templates without having to start over
- 5) Create your Padlet!
  - ◇ I would recommend you create some type of theme/esthetic throughout your Padlet

## How to Save and Submit

- 1) Select **Share** in the top, right corner
- 2) Scroll down to **Export**
- 3) Select **Save as Image**
  - ◇ It will create a PNG
- 4) Copy and Paste that PNG link via the Assignment Submission in Canvas

**\*Padlet works just like Google Docs or Office 365: once you add/subtract something, the Padlet will automatically save.**
