

Constitution One-Pager

Using pages 30-39 of the new textbook, you will create a Constitution One-Pager. A one pager is a single-page response to your reading of a chapter, article, document, or any other reading that may take place in the class. It is a way to communicate your understanding of the material in a unique way. A one-pager allows you to be creative and experimental.

Directions:

1. You must include **all** activities listed below on your one-pager.
2. Create a title for your one-pager at the top of the paper.
3. This will be an individual assignment.
4. You will use a single piece of blank computer paper (fill the entire paper up).
5. Be as creative as possible with your one-pager. It must be in color!

Activities:

Explain the roles of the Legislative Branch, Executive Branch and Judicial Branch
Use at least 7 major visual images that represent the main ideas of the reading. You must draw your pictures.
Place five essential vocabulary words/phrases around the images. These terms/words/phrases should express the main ideas, your impressions, feelings, or thoughts about what you have seen or read.
Explain the 7 principles of government: Popular Sovereignty, Republicanism, Limited Government, Federalism, Separation of Powers, Checks and Balances, and Individual Rights. You can do this with images or words.
Be creative. Communicate your understanding or interpretation of the readings. Create in a way that your audience will understand something about the reading.

Fill the page up. Make it rich with quotes, images, color, etc.

Do not...

- Think half page will do. Your one-pager needs to take up the entire page.
- Just summarize. The goal is to explain this in as simple of terms as possible.
