Assassination of MLK	
MLK went to in Ma	rch of 1968 to strike for sanitation workers
<ul> <li>Wanted to lobby the federal govt.</li> </ul>	to commit billions of dollars to ending poverty and unemployment
<ul> <li>April 4, by sniper</li> </ul>	James Earl Ray, who shot him while MLK was on the balcony of his hotel room
