FINALS SCHEDULE

WHAT WILL THE FINAL CONSIST OF?

Your Great Depression/New Deal Final will look like the following:

- 18 multiple choice questions (3 points each)
- 3 Identification Terms (6 points each)
- 2 Written Response/Free Response Questions (14 points each)

The test will be timed at 35 minutes

You will not be allowed to use your study guide on the test

WHAT ARE IDENTIFICATION TERMS?

You will be given 6 terms related to the Great Depression and/or New Deal. Of the 6 terms, you will need to **pick 3** to create a definition for. You will also need to explain the historical significance of the terms.

For Example, if one of the terms listed was Hooverville, your ID may look something like:

- **Hooverville**- Homeless communities created during the Great Depression because people had lost their jobs and their homes. They were named after President Hoover, whom the American people were not happy with. Hooverville's reflected the struggles Americans faced during the Great Depression.

Identification:

Choose three of the following terms from the box below and write an explanation of what it is and why it is historically significant. Each term is worth 6 points.

Zimmerman Telegram	Lusitania	Imperialism
Neutrality	Treaty of Versailles	Yellow Journalism

WRITTEN RESPONSE QUESTIONS

You will have two free response questions to respond to.

- The more detail/evidence you can provide, the better your score.
- At least a paragraph (5-8 sentences) will be necessary for both questions.

Ex: What effects did the Great Depression have on the American people?

Answer 1: People lost their jobs and it was sad.

Answer 2: The Great Depression had a significant impact on the American people. Many farmers lost their land due to buying land/equipment on credit and overusing their land, causing the Dust Bowl. Unemployment reached 25%, which meant many Americans did not have jobs and were unable to take care of themselves or their families. This resulted in many Americans moving to Hooverville's, being evicted from their homes, starving to death or committing suicide. Americans relied on soup kitchens for food and some even had odd jobs, such as selling pencils, to try and make money.

FINAL THOUGHTS

If you spell something wrong in your written responses or an 'I' isn't capitalized, you're not going to be marked down for those things. I care about the content, not the grammar.
